

→ DECLARATION OF INTENTION.



THE STATE OF OHIO, HAMILTON COUNTY.

HAMITETON COUNTY Personally appeared before me, the undersigned, Clerk of the Court of COMMON PLEAS within and for the County of Hamilton, aforesaid a native of years, bearing allegiance to the on the , and who intends to reside within the jurisdiction and under the GOVERNMENT OF THE UNITED STATES, to-wit: And he makes report of himself for NATURALIZATION, and declares on oath that it is bona fide his intention to become a CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, and to forever renounce and abjure all ALLEGIANCE AND FIDELITY to every FOREIGN PRINCE POTENTATE, STATE AND SOYEREIGNITY whatsoever, and particularly to the Coheche Sworn to and subscribed before me this. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my

hand, and affixed the seal of said Court, at Cincinnati, the day and year last above written.

Note: During a riot in 1884 the Hamilton Co. Courthouse was burned and many records were destroyed. A great many of the citizenship documents were lost forever, but a significant number that survived were "restored". This record was restored.
